JSTOR: We have added two new collections to our JSTOR database coverage. You will now find more journals related to archaeology, classics, economics, film studies, folklore, history, performing arts, religion, the history and study of art and architecture, and African, Asian, Latin American, Middle Eastern, and Slavic studies. SPECIALTY CATALOG SEARCH BOXES

The Dulaney-Browne Library has three specialty search boxes located on its website: thesis, scores, and media.

The thesis search box is located on the Archives page near the bottom. (www.okcu.edu/library/archives.aspx) The drop down menu beside the search box gives you the option to search by department or degree, author, or a keyword from the title. search you are searching the title, author, table of contents, and subject fields of the catalog record. If you are not getting the results you need from this search you should try either the title or title phrase search, which only searches within the title of scores. Another search strategy is to type in the instrument such as piano

or violin in the search box and choose subject from the drop down menu.

MEDIA

The media search box is located on the media collection page. (www.okcu.edu/library/media.aspx) The media box searches for both VHS and DVD items. You can perform a keyword, title,

title phrase, or actor/actress search. You can also search by director using the actor/actress search. Remember to type in the last name first. (last name, first name)

Unfortunately, these search boxes are only good for one search. Once you have your results, if you perform another search within the catalog it will not be limited to just thesis, scores, or media. You must return to

the original search boxes to perform further limited searches.
