## New at the Library:

**Easter and Finals Hours:** Easter Weekend comes very close to finals this year. The library will remain open for its regular hours on Good Friday (April 22nd 7:30am-7:00pm) and Saturday April 23rd (10:00am-7:00pm). Easter Sunday will have reduced hours (3:00pm-Midnight), and extended (2:00am) hours for finals preparation will begin on Monday, April 25th. Check out the calendar for more details. **5th Floor Update:** Work is nearly complete. The library's Children's Literature, Curriculum, and Oversize collections have already moved to the 5th floor bookshelves. 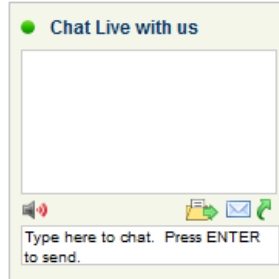
