New at the Library:

5th Floor Renovation: The work on the 5th floor should be completed during the month of January. Once the major construction work is complete, library staff will begin the process of moving materials back to the floor and setting up a checkout system for the new study rooms.

Reduced Hours: The library continues to suffer from staffing shortages, the library will have reduced evening and weekend hours in the month of January. The library will be closing 1 hour earlier (at 6:00 p.m.) on Fridays and Saturdays and 2 hours earlier (at 10:00 p.m.) Sunday through Thursday. The library will also open later (at 2:00 p.m.) on Sundays. We hope to return to our normal semester hours after a new circulation supervisor is hired in February.

IEEE: The library's subscription to IEEE expired as of December 31st. However, the library added Computers and Applied Sciences Complete database which includes many more full text journals on computers and related fields. If the IEEE or other titles you need are not full text in Computers and Applied sciences Complete, you can use interlibrary loan to request a copy of the item. Just be sure to allow sufficient time for the interlibrary loan process which can take from 3 days to 3 weeks.



EBRARY (E-books & Sheet Music)



Ebrary provides access to full-text electronic books, journals, magazines, maps, and music scores. These items (except scores) have already been added to the Dulaney-Browne Library catalog (library.okcu.edu/catalog). You can tell an item is from ebrary in the catalog in two ways; first it will say "[electronic resource]" in the title and second there will be a link in the record that says "an electronic book accessible through the World Wide Web: click to view."

You can view Ebrary items using the Ebrary

reader software. When you click to view an Ebrary item the javascript viewer (plugin required) will allow you to view the item without installed the reader software, but it may prompt you to allow the installation of a plugin for your browser. The readers software allows you to add bookmarks, notes and highlights. If you would like to be able to use these features click on the ebrary reader icon from within the javascript viewer.



You can also search Ebrary directly by going

to the library's database page (www.okcu.edu/dbtitle.aspx) and clicking on Ebrary. This is also where the Ebrary Sheet Music link is located. The links are listed in alphabetical order.

Ebrary Sheet Music is arranged by categories such as choral, opera, Piano Duet, Score, Vocal, Woodwinds Flute, etc.. Once you choose a category you can then choose a composer and then a piece of music.

*If printing on a MAC choose the legal paper size.

Printing in the Library



There are four printers in the library. All but one look like copy machines. There are two printers just inside the front doors and to the right. All of the computers on the first floor default to one of these printers except for the first floor computer lab. The computer lab has its own printer, which does not look like a copier. The

printer is located in the back left corner of the lab. The fourth printer is on the second floor and is in the same spot as the first floor printers. All second, third, and fourth floor computers default to it.

The only color printer is the copy machine on the first floor in the corner. In order to print in color you

must use your computer to tell the printer to print in color by choosing the following: file-properties-paper/Quality-color
