New at the Library:

Dulaney-Browne Summer Hours:

Summer is the perfect time to catch up on your reading. Here are some items available at the Dulaney-Browne Library for your consideration.

Breeding Contempt: the history of coerced sterilization in the United States by Mark A. Largent

People were coerced into sterilization? Who knew? This book discusses the history of sterilization in the United States. More specifically it details doctors who were advocating sterilization in the mid-nineteenth century and early twentieth century. They

wanted to sterilize people that were viewed as degenerates such as criminals and mental health patients. The book goes on to discuss public figures that still hold these same sentiments/prejudices today. One example is the forced birth control of welfare mothers.

Superpower on Crusade: the Bush doctrine in US foreign policy by Mel Gurtov

From the very beginning Bush has been criticized for his take on foreign policy. This book explores US foreign policy, taking a more

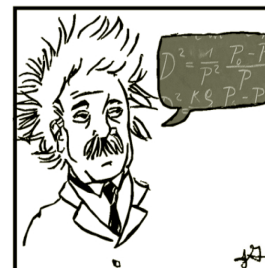
specific view that it calls "the Bush Doctrine." The Wars on Communism and Terror are explored as well as the Iraq War and North Korea.
