## OKLAHOMAN ARCHIVES



What were people saying and doing on Statehood Day, November 16, 1907? When did Clara Luper begin her sit-ins at lunch counters in Oklahoma City? What president signed the proclamation making Oklahoma a state? What football team did OCU play in its 1947 homecoming game? You can find out in *The Oklahoman Archives* online through the Dulaney-Browne Library.

To browse or search the entire archives of the Oklahoma (September 25, 1901 to yesterday), start at the library's homepage at <http://www.okcu.edu/>

[library](#) and choose "SEARCH ONLINE RESOURCES." The link to *The Oklahoman Archives* is under "FINDING ARTICLES" – "Newspapers." The page opens to the browse function. Choose the month, day, and year to browse through the paper. To search, click on the search tab, choose your search period, type your search and click go. Be sure to choose your search period. The default search is 1901 to 1910, so you need to change that to search other dates.

pictures, or advertisements and sort results by rank score, title, date, section, or length. The search and display functions can be slow, and may be especially slow as Statehood Day approaches. Don't be surprised if results take more than a few seconds to appear on the screen.

In case you don't have time to look them up, here are some of the headlines from the November 16, 1907 Daily Oklahoman: "Statehood Proclamation Will Be Issued Today: Oklahoma Passes from Carpetbag Rule into Sisterhood of States," "Commission Inserting Probe: Commerce Hearing is in Progress in District Court," "Posse Pursues Negro Slayer of White Man,"

"Brown's Spell Held Annie Bradley Fast," "New Officers Will Take Up Duties Today," "2 Cent Fare Effective at 9 this a.m.," "Wife Slayer Held for Trial: Bail Refused," "Woman 'Railroaded' to Protect Others?
